School principal	<ul> <li>The principal as Nominated Supervisor, Educational Leader and Responsible Person holds primary responsibility for the preschool.</li> <li>The principal is responsible for ensuring: <ul> <li>the preschool is compliant with legislative standards related to this procedure at all times</li> <li>all staff involved in the preschool are familiar with and implement this procedure</li> <li>all procedures are current and reviewed as part of a continuous cycle of self-assessment.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

	Each educator takes responsibility for ensuring their first aid qualific remain current by monitoring the expiry date / s and alerting the pre- supervisor or principal prior to requiring retraining.	

First aid kit	<ul> <li>First aid kits are stored on the preschool site.</li> <li>A full first aid kit is located in the Preschool office. The general use EpiPen and asthma kit are located in the office.</li> <li>A portable first aid kit is assembled in a backpack for outdoor play/visits to the K-2 school/ excursions/evacuations. This portable first aid kit also contains a general epipen and general asthma kit. It is stored in the preschool office.</li> <li>The kits are inaccessible to children, but easily recognisable and accessible to adults.</li> <li>A written record of the contents of the kit /s is maintained, including the contents' expiry dates. The full time preschool SLSO maintains the list and checks the contents every 6 months. The kits are restocked at the beginning of each year and whenever required.</li> <li>For use in an emergency situation, the first aid kit contains a general - use EpiPen Junior and asthma reliever medication (Ventolin) and instructions for their use - the ASCIA First Aid Plan for Anaphylaxis (ORANGE) EpiPen and the Asthma Care Plan for Education and Care Services.</li> <li>The location of this emergency medication is clearly noted on the outside of the kit for the information of all staff, visitors and volunteers.</li> <li>Signage is in place to indicate the location of first aid kits/EpiPen and asthma kit in the preschool office.</li> <li>A portable first aid kit is assembled in a backpack for all outdoor play/visits to the K-2 school/ excursions/evacuations. This portable first aid kit also contains a general epipen and general asthma kit. It is stored in the preschool office.</li> <li>When the group leaves the preschool to evacuate, for an excursion or to go into the school site, the following is taken:</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Portable first aid kit containing: -</li> <li>the general use emergency medication (anaphylaxis epipen and asthma) and instructions for use.</li> <li>Emergency services telephone numbers</li> <li>Children's emergency contact details.</li> <li>Accident forms</li> </ul> Any individual children's emergency medication and medical management plans.
	<ul><li>Attendance roll for that day.</li><li>The full time preschool SLSO collects and carries the kit and medication.</li></ul>
Administration of first aid	<ul> <li>In any medical emergency an ambulance will be called immediately by one of the preschool staff.</li> <li>In an anaphylaxis or asthma emergency situation, preschool educators will administer emergency medication (EpiPen Jr or Ventolin) to a child who requires it. Parent / carer authorisation is not required for this.</li> <li>If emergency medication is administered: <ul> <li>an ambulance will be called</li> <li>the principal and child's parent or carer will be notified</li> <li>a notification will be made to Early Learning (phone 1300 083 698) within 24 hours.</li> </ul> </li> <li>If a child requires it, they will be administered first aid. This will be performed by the nominated first aider.</li> <li>After first aid has been administered, the details will be recorded in an <i>Incident</i>,</li> </ul>

<i>injury, trauma and illness record.</i> This will be recorded by the preschool teacher and the record is stored securely in the preschool office.
• On collecting their child from preschool, the parent or carer will be notified of the circumstances surrounding the administration of first aid to their child and they will be asked to sign the completed <i>Incident, injury, trauma and illness record</i> as confirmation of this.
<ul> <li>If the child then sees a medical practitioner in relation to their injury, a notification will be made to Early Learning (phone 1300 083 698) within 24 hours of the preschool staff becoming aware the child was taken for medical attention.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>If a child suffers a head or bite injury, their parent will be contacted as soon as practical by the school office or SLSO.</li> </ul>
